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4.0 APPROVE MINUTES OF JULY 10, 2023 MEETING

With a motion by Clark and second by Ryan, the minutes of July 10, 2023 were approved.

6.0 REGULAR AGENDA

- 6.1 Systems Division Update Status Reports
 - 6.1.1 Motorola CAD Upgrade

Bloss reported that Motorola expects to deliver the new hardware this year which he hopes will be installed in January followed by provisioning and testing with a go-live date in February. This will be a version upgrade from V4.5 to V4.6 and the user interface should be fairly similar to what is already in place. Uchida noted any new features will be forwarded to the Task Teams for review and dissemination. She hopes to have a detailed timeline by the November Users meeting.

- 6.2 Coordination on Major Events Involving Fire and Law Discuss
 - The group agreed the Wharf-to-Wharf event went well.
 - Clark inquired of any feedback regarding the Active Shooter drill. Nee noted it was a
 fantastic drill and suggested, in the future, more advanced warning so NetCom
 dispatch staff could attend as well as encouraging more agency participation.

6.3 CAD/Mobile

6.3.1 Mobiles

Bloss reported some MDCs are being updated at several of the law agencies. The Axon installment is happening in Watsonville. Uchida noted, in the Fire/EMS meeting, Baldwin will be soliciting some participating in the Motorola groups that are related to the mobile. Baldwin noted, one of the goals in the task teams, is looking at technology other agencies are using and she encouraged the agencies to keep NetCom apprised.

7.0 OTHER ISSUES

7.1 Use of 9-1-1

Baldwin reported that dispatch has been informed by some Santa Cruz City workers that they have been directed to call 9-1-1 for low level issues. Uchida noted there is a limited capacity for the 9-1-1 lines and the intent is for emergency use. She would like NetCom to be involved in any conversations regarding the proper use of the 9-1-1 lines with city and county staff. Uchida informed the group that she plans on following up with the City Manager's office to see if this may have been a direction that came from that office.

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8.0 CORRESPONDENCE

9.0 ROUND TABLE

- Oatey reported on Santa Cruz Fire's upcoming Open House on Saturday, September 16.
- Avila reported on a GoFundMe for deceased GIS employee, Aaron Cole. He noted how productive Aaron was during the storms.
- Correira reported on a successful CPR save as well as a double fatality wreck and thanked the NetCom staff for their handling of these incidents.
- Correira reported on a repeater talk group for one specific building in Scotts Valley and noted he may be requesting permission, at a future meeting, to use Yellow there.
- Benson reported he is renewing the RediNet PO which is what the hospitals use to communicate if they are on diversion, or not. He noted Law has been added as a user of RediNet so they can choose to not go through NetCom to determine if telecare is on diversion. If Law agencies would prefer to go through NetCom, he will let the PO expire out next year. Clark confirmed that SCSO will continue to get this information from NetCom. Baldwin noted there was discussion, at the Law Task Team level, about this information being accessible on the MDCs. Benson reported the system will be available next year and there are some other situational features that could be useful.
- Uchida reported work continues in the new alerting system of building city and agency sub groups so people can handle their own call outs. Work continues with the vendor to get additional training and some layers pre-built.
