1.0 Purpose

The Santa Cruz County Anti-Crime Team (S.C.C.A.C.T) is comprised of peace officers from law enforcement agencies in Santa Cruz County. Its mission is to significantly reduce and prevent the ability of criminal organizations and individuals to commit serious and violent crimes, including serious major narcotic offenses, gang related criminal activity and to apprehend responsible offenders and bring them to justice. S.C.C.A.C.T strives to accomplish this work by combining the resources of City, County, State and Federal Law Enforcement agencies.

2.0 Procedure

Anytime a patrol supervisor, local or out-of-county, is in need of help or advice from S.C.C.A.C.T., or they simply want to make the team aware of an incident they should contact a team member personally or through dispatch. Contact should be to the S.C.C.A.C.T. Commander or the S.C.C.A.C.T. Supervisor.

All S.C.C.A.C.T officers radio call signs begin with G (George), followed by their individual number.
