

A statewide OES agreement allows use of the listed frequencies. Those frequencies not covered under the OES agreement have specific agreements that allow the installation of the frequencies. Any channel that is installed as a “Local Option” must have a corresponding use agreement between the agencies.

The channels listed have specific use requirements and restrictions. The user is responsible for understanding the restrictions and requesting specific permission for use based on the needs of the cooperating agencies.

Radio frequencies are shared throughout the state. It is imperative that users realize that an obscure tactical channel in a local area may be a primary channel in another area.
