The smell of natural gas or LPG (for example, propane and butane), or a known or suspected leak from a pipeline, meter, heating unit, storage tank or appliance requires fire service investigation. Ask sufficient questions to appropriately classify the call.

- Is the smell or leak indoors or out of doors?
- Is it natural gas or LPG?
- Is the source of the smell or leak known?
- What is the size of the tank?

Dispatch according to CAD recommendations.

Natural Gas

If a gas pipeline or meter is involved, notify Pacific Gas & Electric immediately.

• Provide updates to PG&E as given by responding fire units and vice versa.

LPG

• Notify LPG vendor, if known.
