


The Multiple Casualty Incident Plan (MCIP) is designed to coordinate multiple agency response to a single site disaster which could overwhelm the day to day emergency medical response system. It is not intended to accommodate a county wide, on-going disaster.

The MCIP may be activated upon the specific request of a fire, law enforcement, health or medical representative. This request will usually occur as the result of a normal emergency response by field units. The individual requesting MCIP activation should provide:

- Type of incident
- Location of incident
- Location of staging area
- Best access route
- Approximate number of patients
- Types of injuries, if known
- Need for special resources (for example: jaws, extrication equipment, helicopter, etc.)

The Incident Commander (IC) must request any additional resources by number needed and type.
