SUBJECT: INTERNET WEBSHT

- 1.0 Purpose
 - 1.1 To provide guidelines for the development and maintenance of the organization's website.
 - 1.2 To identify the responsibilities of the Webmaster.
 - 1.3 To provide a method for submitting information to be included in the website content.

2.0 Development

- 2.1 Technical development for the website is the responsibility of the Systems Unit.
- 2.2 Maintenance of the website is the responsibility of the Systems Unit.
 - 2.2.1 The Systems Coordinator may appoint an assistant to serve as Webmaster.
- 2.3 The website will include specific sections for providing information to the public, User Agencies, and other organizations.
 - 2.3.1 These sections will include an introduction, Training, Employment, Newsletter, Public Information, and User Information.

- 3.0 Webmaster Responsibility
 - 3.1 The Webmaster is responsible for website security, HTML programming, registering web pages with search engines and running statistical reports on the website.
- 4.0 Website Content
 - 4.1 Information considered appropriate for the website must benefit to at least one of three main groups: Public, User Agencies, or the Authority.
 - 4.2 Requests to place content on the website will be submitted to the Support Services Manager.
 - 4.2.1 When appropriate, staff members may update their sections of the website.
 - 4.3 The suggested content will be reviewed by the Training Supervisor.
 - 4.3.1 If appropriate, the information will be forwarded to the Webmaster for inclusion in the website.
 - 4.3.2 If not appropriate, the information will be returned with an explanation.
 - 4.3.3 If information is date sensitive, a beginning and ending date should be included in the request.
